ADDENDUM A

ABOUT THE APPLICATION PROCESS

Pre-requisite:

A Bachelor's degree is required. However, we recognize that many people have engaged in life and learning experiences in a variety of contexts that can develop knowledge and abilities that equal a Bachelor degree. Applicants without a Bachelor's degree can apply for an education equivalency/life experience waiver of this requirement, by completing a *Bachelors Degree Pre-requisite Waiver Request*, available from our office.

Application

A written application, transcript and letters of recommendation are required. Application materials can be sent in as they are completed, they do not all have to arrive together.

Application Deadline:

This course operates on rolling admissions; students can apply and begin their studies in most months of the year. Plan to have application materials in no later than 2 months (and ideally 3 months) prior to the date of the first course you wish to attend.

Interview

Once all application materials are received, you will be contacted for a live or by Zoom interview.

Acceptance

If accepted into the program, you will receive an acceptance letter and all that you need to get started in the program. Plan on a minimum of one month's time to prepare for your first course (administrative forms, program orientation, reading and homework assignments for your first course).

Sample admissions timeline:

February 1 – Complete application package received

February 14 – Application materials reviewed and interview scheduled

March 1 – Interview held. Acceptance (or denial) letter received (immediately thereafter)

March 7 – Student enrollment materials shared (if accepted)

March 10 – New Student Orientation scheduled (online orientation will occur at least two months before attendance)

March 15 – CHI Primer (program pre-requisites) and homework assignments provided

In March and April – Complete CHI Primer and first course assignments

May 1 – First program fee payment due

May 14 – First course homework assignment due

May 15 – First day of class
